Alum Continues PAA Music Legacy

Ivan Danilich, Class of 2018, will tell you he's realized his dream – teaching Guitar right here at his alma mater.

He is the third PAA alumnus to follow in the path blazed by their teacher, the late Tim Ellis, well-known Portland guitarist, musician and music producer who taught guitar and the Performance & Production class at PAA for 20 years.

Attending PAA and taking guitar from Ellis changed the trajectory of Ivan's life.

During his sophomore year after surpassing Guitar II level skills, Ellis began giving Ivan more challenging material. That's when things changed for him.

"I decided to learn a really complex song by myself," he said, "my gypsy jazz song, 'Midnight in Paris.'

"After class I played the whole song for him and he was really impressed. And I remember feeling 'nice,' because it was really my first time performing, and Tim's response of, 'Wow, you did a really good job.'

"And that was the moment it sparked, 'OK, I can really do this, and Tim believed in me.'"

Ivan also learned from Ellis that he could play guitar

guitar at age 16. Pursuing a career in the music business led him to Walla Walla University (WWU) where he graduated in May with a degree in music and business.

His online teaching exploded during the pandemic while he was at WWU. In September, Ivan established his online music school and has already hired another music teacher.

His dream is to grow his online music school by hiring more teachers of other instruments and eventually opening physical locations with performance auditoriums across the country.

He often plays lead guitar in rock violinist Aaron Meyer's band, a role Ellis held before his death.

Amidst the success in his young life, Ivan remains humble, grateful and focused on the Source of his success, while remaining true to the Adventist Christian values he learned at home and that were reinforced at PAA.

"From a young age," Ivan said, "my dad was telling me, 'You have to be like Joseph. You have to stand up for the truth. God will bless you 10 times greater."

Ivan saw this truth clearly during the seven years he trained with a Bulgarian Olympic gymnastics coach who wanted him to compete on Sabbath, but Ivan refused.

"Every time my team would go perform on Sabbath, everyone would lose," he recalled. "Our team would not even come close to third place.

"Every time we did something outside of Sabbath, and I was performing, we'd win first place" as a

Kenalo Cooper '17 is taking architecture at Portland State University


